Set in the Hampshire village of Holybourne, our home is an elegant Georgian residence with its own special period charms. Once upon a time, it was the home of famous Victorian novelist, Elizabeth Gaskell. Over the years it has been sympathetically renovated, keeping its lovely original touches while also being modernised for total comfort.

The Lawn is an active part of the local community. For instance, many of our residents enjoy popping into the pub next door or attending the village church. We also have open and flexible visiting hours, meaning that your loved ones can drop by at any time.

You can mingle with others in a range of shared spaces, including two sitting rooms with good natural light and a spacious dining room. The grounds include sweeping lawns and a shaded woodland area. At the bottom of the garden is a fairytale stream where you read, relax or enjoy the company of your loved ones. Our Hearing Loop makes life much easier for many of our residents. We are also proud of our innovative Dementia Education Programme, which includes an in-house Dementia Champion.
